- Intro to Google Slides

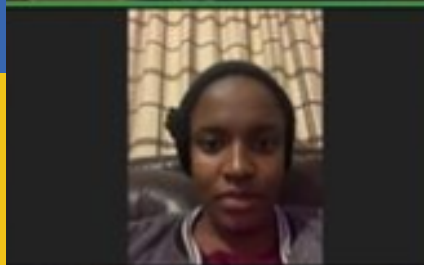
